

GLOBAL LEADERSHIP TEAM

As a leader, you know just how critical quality leadership is to the overall success of any organization, including ours. An effective leadership team provides the vision, guidance and motivation necessary for Lions Clubs International to continue to fulfill its mission of providing quality, relevant service to the global community.

The new Global Leadership Team, or GLT, provides a concentrated focus on active leadership development. Beginning in 2011-2012, the GLT will encourage the identification and development of leaders at all levels of the association, while providing valuable information, guidance and motivation. By encompassing representation at the multiple district and district levels and by including district governor teams, the GLT structure provides a comprehensive global platform for developing more qualified leaders from the club level up, while encouraging regional training and development approaches to address local needs.

A Global Leadership Team Orientation was conducted in Oak Brook in January 2011 to launch this exciting new initiative. Participants in this two-day, interactive session represented the GLT Executive Council, including International President Sid Scruggs III, First Vice President Wing-Kun Tam, Second Vice President Wayne Madden, and GMT/GLT International Coordinator Drs. Ton Soeters, GLT Constitutional Area Leaders, GLT Area Leaders, and GLT Special Area Advisors from around the world. All expressed enthusiasm and optimism about the potential impact of the GLT and reconfirmed their commitment to quality Lions leadership development.



Global Leadership Team

The appointment process related to GLT positions at the multiple district, single district and sub-district levels is underway. The selection of GLT-MD Coordinators and other team members is facilitated by the Council of Governors in consultation with the Council Chairperson and respective GLT Area Leader and/or Special Area Advisor. GLT-D Coordinators and other team members are selected by the District Governor Team in consultation with the GLT-MD Coordinator and respective GLT Area Leader and/or Special Area Advisor. As GLT appointments are for a three-year term (subject to annual confirmation), it is critical that these selections are made in a thoughtful, collaborative manner.

The GLT strives not only to identify and develop future Lions leaders, but to train, educate, mentor and motivate leaders as well. In the end, the efforts of the GLT will ensure our association's future vitality by expanding the pool of skilled Lions leaders and enhancing our ability for effective succession planning.
